Jesus Cleanses the Temple (John 2)

At Passover, Jews traveled from all over to go to Jerusalem. They would have gone up regardless of the direction they came from because the city was on a hill. Herod had renovated the temple. Here's how Josephus described it.

> The exterior of the building wanted nothing that could astound either mind or eye. For, being covered on all sides with massive plates of gold, the sun was no sooner up that it radiated so fiery a flash that persons straining to look at it were compelled to avert their eyes, as from the solar rays. To approaching strangers it appeared from a distance like a snow-clad mountain; for all that was overlaid with gold was of the purest white. (Wars 5.5.6)

The rabbis, who did not like Herod, admitted that "he who has not seen the Temple of Herod has never seen a beautiful building" (b. B. Bat 4a).

Jesus is, first, in the temple courts (hieron), in distinction from the actual temple (2:20; naos). Interestingly enough, when Paul refers to the church and individual Christian as the temple of the Holy Spirit, he uses naos (1 Cor. 3:16; 6:19). For the pilgrims who traveled far, the sale of sacrificial animals rendered a service to them rather than having to carry an animal a long distance. Also, considering where one came from, they would need to exchange their local currency with that of Jerusalem to purchase the animals. The upcharge for currency exchange was how the money changers profited from worshippers. Previously, this was done across the Kidron Valley on the Mount of Olives. For some reason, it had moved into the temple courts.

Jesus' zeal for the temple was akin to Phineas, who drove out sin from the tabernacle. Because his actions bucked convention, the Jews wanted a sign to justify what he'd done. He foretold of his temple (body) being destroyed and raised in three days, but they believed he was speaking of Herod's temple. Even his disciples wouldn't understand it until he rose from the dead

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. (*Matthew 4:1*)

At the end of Matthew chapter 3, Jesus identified with sinners by being baptized – even when He didn't need to be baptized for His own sake. Now, in Matthew 4, the sinless Savior will again identify with sinful humanity, this time in severe temptation. This was a necessary part of His ministry, so He truly was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness.

Tested by the Devil

It was a remarkable contrast between the glory following Jesus' baptism and the challenge to be tempted by the devil.

- Then, the cool waters of the Jordan; now the barren wilderness.
- Then, the huge crowds; now solitude and silence.
- Then, the Spirit rests like a dove; now the Spirit drives Him into the wilderness.
- Then, the voice of the Father calling Him "Beloved Son"; now the hiss of Satan the tempter.
- Then, anointed; now attacked.
- Then, the water of baptism; now the fire of temptation.
- Then, the heavens opened; now hell seemed to open against the Savior.

Jesus did not need to be tempted to help Him grow. Instead, He endured temptation both so that He could identify with us (Hebrews 2:18 and 4:15), and to demonstrate His own holy, sinless character. We will be both tempted and tested -If our Savior endured these for the glory of God, it should not surprise us when we must endure them as well.

Very rarely, but occasionally, someone will come along and actually IMPROVE an old tune. This happens when the original composer wrote music that was not necessarily intended for a'cappella congregations and one good example of this is Horatio Palmer's 1868 hymn "Yield Not To Temptation." This is a lovely tune with a strong Biblical message EXCEPT for one thing.

Generations have sung the tune with only a duet part down to the refrain and this very often results in a weak start while folks wait for the full four-part harmony.

Fortunately for us, a few hymnal compilers in recent decades have added the full harmony from the beginning and, to me, this has been a great improvement. Our current hymnal (#905) does not include this full harmony although they added some parts to the women's duet. In next week's piece, I will mention "Lead Me Gently Home, Father," "Whispering Hope," and "O Heart Bowed Down with sorrow."
