The First Miracle (John 2)

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Matthew 3:1-2)

Some people think that repentance is mostly about feelings, especially feeling sorry for your sin. It is good to feel sorry about sin, but repent isn't a word focused on feelings. It is focused on action. John everyone to make a change of the mind, not merely to feel sorry for what they had done. Repentance means changing direction, not sorrow in the heart.

- Repent was the first word of John the Baptist's gospel (Matthew 3:1-2).
- Repent was the first word of the gospel Jesus preached (Matthew 4:17, Mark 1:14-15).
- Repent was the first word in the preaching ministry of the twelve disciples (Mark 6:12).
- Repent was the first word in the preaching instructions Jesus gave to His disciples after His resurrection (Luke 24:46-47).
- Repent was the first word of exhortation in the first Christian sermon (Acts 2:38).
- Repent was the first word in the mouth of the apostle Paul through his ministry (Acts 26:19-20).

John wanted people to know that the kingdom of heaven was near – it was as close as your hand. It wasn't as distant or as dreamy as they had imagined. This was why John was so urgent in his call to repentance. If the kingdom of heaven is at hand, then we must get ready now.

There's no better way to be ready for Jesus than to live in constant repentance.

We're going to read about the first miracle Jesus performed, and he did so at a wedding. Men wedded between 18–24 and women as early as 13 or 14. A Jewish wedding was a joyful occasion for the bride, groom, family, and the community. On the wedding day, the bride was taken from her father's home to her husband in a joyful procession. The bride veiled her face and was surrounded by bridesmaids. Friends of the groom would have led her to her husband, and they were crowned with garlands. After the couple had signed the marriage contract, the marriage supper followed. The celebration could last an entire day, and friends of the bridegroom would lead them to the bridal chamber.

When we arrive at the setting, they're at the marriage supper. Jesus was with his mother and disciples, so this is likely a relative or friend, which may explain why Mary brought the problem to Jesus. Wine symbolized joy: "There is no rejoicing save with wine" (b. Pesach 109a). To not have wine was an embarrassment. Moreover, Jews envisioned the Messianic age as flowing with wine (cf. Jer. 31:12; Amos 9:13–14). Scripture is clear that drunkenness is sinful (1 Cor. 5:11; Gal. 5:21). Yet we don't know to what degree the wine here intoxicated. Nevertheless, what we call wine and what they call wine are different things. People often added water to wine to dilute it when it was intense, which they called wine. "We call a mixture wine although the larger part of the parts is water" (Plutarch, Mor. 140f; c. first century). The average person who drank in the first century would have considered drinking undiluted wine barbaric.

Jesus' reply in verse four might come across as disrespectful, and some argue for such an interpretation, but, at best, we might say it was distant. Addressing his mother as "woman" would have been akin to our "ma'am," but the second phrase is often disrespectful. This verse and the next seem odd until we further understand. "My hour has not yet come" is another way of saying, "Once I begin miracles, my path to the cross begins." Mary's reply was one of complete faith. Mary is trusting that Jesus will answer her entreaty. Jesus has pots filled with water, and as the banquet master drank the water, it turned to wine. This was Jesus' first miracle.

As a general rule, I do not like for editors and compilers of hymnbooks to "tamper" with long-established hymns or gospel songs that generations have known. There are, however, a few old ones that have benefited (or could benefit) from a bit of tweaking of the music to make it easier for a' cappella congregations to sing. These are tunes with long runs of two parts – usually soprano and alto.

One such example is the favorite "I Come To The Garden Alone" (#595 in our book) wherein the women have a long duet run before finally reaching the point where the men can join the full 4-part harmony. I think that a few books published in recent decades now have included a new rendition of this which greatly improves the overall effect. Others which fall into this general category include such old numbers as "Yield Not to Temptation," "Lead Me Gently Home, Father,' "Whispering Hope", "O Heart Bowed Down With Sorrow" and a few more.
