God's Wrath

(John 3:22-4:4; Luke 3:19-20)

Elder Selection Schedule

Through April 13th – There are Elder nomination forms available on the tables in the Commons.

April 13th – PM Service – Deadline for turning in Elder nomination forms.

April 14th-15th - Elders will meet and gather form information and compile a list of prospective Elders. The Elders will use the next 20 days to talk to the men chosen as prospective Elders.

May 4th - Specific names will be presented to the congregation as possible additional Elders. These men will have had contact with the current Elders as to their qualifications and willingness to serve. Members have one week to submit written and signed reasons as to why someone should not serve as an Elder.

May 11th – The final day for Glendale Road members to express in writing and sign any objections they may have as to why any of the men whose names been submitted have to the congregation should not serve as Elders.

May 18th – Tentative date to appoint additional Elders.

We don't like to talk much about God's wrath because it can sound too harsh and dilute our picture of a loving God. The author mentioned that Jesus wasn't sent to condemn the world (John 3:17), so this conclusion eliminates any misunderstanding that judgment is nonexistent (John 3:36). God's wrath isn't God losing his temper. John has already shown us that the father came to earth as the son, and the son endured the cross to keep us from condemnation. God would rather die than we should incur his wrath.

In the Old Testament, God is often described as "slow to anger" (Exod. 34:6), which translates to "long of nose." Anytime anger is translated from Hebrew, it comes either from "nose," "heat," or "hot nose." When people become angry, their face flushes, hence "hot nose." God, however, is described as "long of the nose," meaning it takes much longer for his face to flush. He's more patient and longsuffering and gives many chances for change. When we read about his judgment on Pharoah, remember that he sent plagues to provoke Pharoah to change. When he refused and pursued the Israelites, God gave him over to the consequences of his actions—the man who drowned all Israelite boys in the river was himself, along with his fighting men, drowned. Some may still struggle with this, but we can't forget that Pharoah oppressed others who God also loved. That brokenness in our world is what God sought to repair through Jesus.

Meanwhile, John the Baptist removed himself from the scene as Jesus's disciples continued baptizing. He went to Herod and rebuked him for being married to Herodias, his niece. Herod had divorced the daughter of the Nabataean king to do this, but Herodias had divorced his half-brother, Philip. Jewish law prohibited this very thing (Lev. 18:16; 20:21). John had the boldness to rebuke a ruler and was imprisoned for it. Once Jesus learns of John the Baptist's imprisonment, he heads to Galilee (Matt. 4:12; Mark 1:14), but he has to go through Samaria to get there (John 4:3–4).

It is my personal opinion that every Christian home should have at least one hymn book for reference purposes in the event that something comes up on TV or other media that mentions a hymn. This does not mean that every home necessarily needs a whole shelf (or several shelves) of hymnbooks at home as I do. Anyway, I would recommend the following books:

Hymns of Faith & Praise, simply because this is our current pew hymn book and the one most relevant to our use today.

Praise for the Lord in either edition. This is a good mainline Book of some 900 numbers and the book is still in print.

Christian Hymns, preferably the 1948 edition published by the Gospel Advocate Company, that many churches east of the Mississippi used during mid-century.

Great Songs of the Church, any later edition, that Great Songs Press or Abilene Christian University Press printed. Water Street/ 7^{th} & Poplar Street used this book for many years.
