Into the Water

Since my sermon this coming Sunday will focus on baptism, I thought it worthwhile to write a little about it, too. We tend to separate faith and baptism as if they're separate things. They're not. Being baptized is an act of faith. When a person is baptized, they have faith in the working of God (Col. 2:12). Belief always precedes baptism (Mark 16:16; Acts 16:31–33). Infants can't believe it. They lack the capacity.

What has God said regarding this act of faith? We receive forgiveness of our sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). The Holy Spirit makes us a member of the body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:13). We reenact the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus (Rom. 6:3–4). Our sinful person is crucified with Christ (Rom. 6:6).

Why do so many churches observe this practice differently? When the Bible was translated into English, it was done so by clergymen of the Anglican Church. They weren't the first to do it but they gave us the infamous King James Bible. At the time, they practiced sprinkling infants and called that baptism, so rather than translating the Greek term as "immersion," they transliterated it and gave it their definition. In early Christianity, sprinkling was mentioned in the first century, but it was only as an exception if there was not enough water to immerse. That exception later became the rule for some traditions.

In the second century, a bishop taught that only bishops could administer this. This coincided with the change of congregational leadership. In the New Testament and early Christian literature, elder, bishop, and pastor are terms used interchangeably. The same is true of deacons and ministers. In the second century, however, one of the elders/pastors was elevated above the eldership and called bishop. This departure from the apostolic teachings led to more departures and religious pluralism.

By the mid-third century, infant sprinkling had become routine. It's attested to in the letters of Cyprian of Carthage. There is some debate about it being practiced sooner, but by the third century, it was a debated topic with doubtful evidence of it being practiced. By the early fifth century, Augustine's doctrine of original sin had become prevalent.

Now, rather than studying the Scriptures and extrapolating their meaning, many traditions read their "tradition" back into them, passing it off as divinely given. That's just not true. Scripture and early Christian literature show when the changes occurred. As Christians, Scripture should inform us. We have no right to twist it to our will.

Library E. Bailey Pinions & Panoplies

Two of my favorite hymns contain words that are certainly not part of our modern everyday conversation. One is the often-used communion hymn, "Night With Ebon Pinion" by Love H. Jameson (1811-1892). Composed in 1854, the song was included in all three of Sanderson's song books (1935, 1948 & 1966) so folks who sang from the Gospel Advocate hymnbooks were used to singing it. On the other hand, Jorgenson did not include it in any of the editions of *Great Songs of the Church* until the 1975 supplement so, it was unfamiliar to lots of folks.

Based on the account given of Christ's suffering, verse one is drawn from Luke 22. The second verse alludes to both Isaiah 53 and Mark 14 while the third verse harks back to Mark 14, Matthew 26 and Luke 22.

The tune, composed by J. P. Powell, is hauntingly beautiful. (*Tune in next week for words of wisdom on another hymn*)
