Jesus and Nicodemus

Elder Selection Schedule

Through April 13th – <u>There will be</u> <u>Elder nomination forms available when</u> you leave the auditorium.

March 30th – Steven will preach on the requirements of being an Elder.

April 13th – PM Service – Deadline for turning in Elder nomination forms.

April 14th-15th – Elders will meet and gather form information and compile a list of prospective Elders. The Elders will use the next 20 days to talk to the men chosen as prospective Elders.

May 4th – Specific names will be presented to the congregation as possible additional Elders. These men will have had contact with the current Elders as to their qualifications and willingness to serve. Members have one week to submit written and signed reasons as to why someone should not serve as an Elder.

May 11th – The final day for Glendale Road members to express in writing and sign any objections they may have as to why any of the men whose names have been submitted to the congregation should not serve as Elders.

 $May \ 18^{th} - Tentative \ date \ to \ appoint \ additional \ Elders.$

The result of the signs Jesus did (John 2:23) was drawing the attention of an influential Jewish leader. Nicodemus is a Pharisee and ruler of the Jews (John 3:1). Corroborating evidence demonstrates that the name was common in Palestine at this time. Despite Pharisees often appearing as opponents of Jesus, Nicodemus and a few others were more amenable to him. Coming to Jesus at night has caused a lot of speculation. Maybe he wanted a private audience or was afraid to be seen with him. We don't know, and we're not told. Nicodemus addresses Jesus respectfully and cannot deny the signs he has performed. Still, it would appear he is approaching Jesus on behalf of some group ("we" in v. 2). When Jesus replies, he uses the plural "you" in verses 7 and 11–12.

Jesus' answer isn't altogether best translated into English Bibles. It should say "born from above" or "born anew" rather than "born again." Jesus is pointing to a heavenly birth, but Nicodemus envisions only the natural birth a mother gives to a child. Being born of water and Spirit entails baptism (1 Cor. 6:11; 12:13; Titus 3:5). This is the most quoted baptismal passage from second-century Christian literature. Plus, baptism has occupied portions of chapter 1 (vv. 24–34), and John mentions the Spirit in conjunction with baptism at Christ's immersion. The contrast between natural and spiritual birth has already been highlighted in 1:12–13.

The conversion language is taken from Ezekiel 36:25–27, where water and spirit work to cleanse the heart and achieve inner transformation. Gentile converts to Judaism were regarded as newborn children. "And the legal status of a convert who just converted is like that of a child just born" (*b. Yebam.* 22a). "A convert who just converted is like a child just born" (*b. Yebam.* 48b). Here we have the connection between conversion and infancy in Jewish law. The spirit associated with water in Ezekiel 36 was symbolized as the wind in Ezekiel 37.

Nicodemus, an established and recognizable teacher, fails to understand. The earthly things are water and wind, and the heavenly things are rebirth from above by the Spirit. Therefore, heaven can only give divine wisdom—the Spirit (1:32–33), angels (1:51), and the Son of Man (3:13). Yet it's the Son of Man who will be lifted, as the serpent in the wilderness, so that all who believe may have eternal life (cf. 1:4). Each time you see "believe" or one of its cognates, think "faith," or "trust" as I much prefer. It's the same term translated as faith used here as belief.

Most of the long-established hymns and gospel songs that Churches of Christ have sung for generations were not written with *a'cappella* singing in mind. This largely explains why some of these beloved songs have duet parts, usually alto & soprano, that often seem weak,

Some examples from our hymnbook include *Ivory Palaces (#*896), *Lead Me Gently Home, Father* (#823), *O Heart Bowed Down With Sorrow* (# 932) as well as *Whispering Hope* (#497).

Some more recent books published for *a'cappella* churches have made an effort to add full four-part voices to these previously duet sections.

One hymn that has undergone several adaptations over the years and which appears in a variety of musical arrangements is *Whispering Hope* which, in our book has Alton Howard's full four-part harmony all the way thru.
